OPTIONAL WORKSHOPS: 2pm – 5pm

Dogs on the streets – Where do you start?

This workshop demonstrates a participatory approach to problem analysis and project planning based on the Humane Dog Population Management Guidance document issued by the International Companion Animal Management (ICAM) Coalition. Due to the participatory nature of this workshop, numbers will be restricted – facilitated by the World Society for the Protection of Animals (WSPA) €20 per person

It's Cool to be Kind - hands-on dog training and TTouch[®] workshop

TellingtonTouch's Sarah Fisher and behaviourist Carolyn Menteith explore training and behaviour approaches and techniques. €20 per person

Cat TNR; Making it work

The workshop will begin by recapping on some basic TNR essentials. We will then move on to talk about how we as different stakeholders, can play our part in making TNR work. Facilitated by Ian MacFarlaine, Cats Protection. €20 per person

Shelter visit: 11am or 1pm

An optional visit to a local animal shelter in Troja, on the outskirts of Prague, which is one of two shelters overseen by the Metropolitan Police. The shelter also serves as a center for animal control services, shelter staff, veterinary services and as a zoo.

An additional shelter in Dolni Mecholupy, Prague 10 takes care of cats and various other animals. Both shelters run educational programs that introduce the public to their work. The visit provides an interesting opportunity to explore how animal services can be conducted with close cooperation between the shelter administration and Prague's Metropolitan Police Department.

ICAWC will host a complimentary welcome buffet dinner on the first night of the conference. Guests will be treated to a wonderful evening of great local food and entertainment including traditional Czech dancing and music, performed by a four-piece band.
